

HOLSTER COURSE FAQ

The following are questions and answers relating to the new holster course and have been added to help with clarity.

Questions relating to the CAS Holster Course:

Q- Which course does one have to sit to be qualified to shoot "Wild Bunch CAS Shooting"?

A- You have to sit and pass the ACTION holster course qualification to be able to shoot "Wild Bunch".

Q- Does the Holster belt, under the Action course, have to go through the trouser belt loops to be legal in "Wild Bunch" Shooting?

A- Not in wild Bunch, this is NOT a requirement. This is only a requirement for the OTHER action disciplines. E.G Speed, Action, IPSC, Service, 3 Gun

Questions relating to the Action and CAS Holster course: (Instructors notes)

Q- Does a junior, younger than 16 years of age; have to sign off the final completion form where it says "firearms licence"?

A- A junior who is younger than 16 needs to sit and pass the "Junior Proficiency badge test". Once this is done, the assessor just needs to add "junior badge" to this line.

Retraining:

Q- Do I have to resist the Holster test if I have not shot from a holster for a while?

A- If you have not shot from a holster for 5 years, your club Holster Instructor, should take you through the final, shot test to check that your safety skills and training are still adequate for the pistol you are about to use.

Shooters who fit this category should approach their club Instructors to have this tested.

If you change the style of pistol (Auto, Revolver, Production, S/A Revolver) you wish to shoot from a holster, you should ask your Instructor for additional training before you proceed.
