

Practical differences between current Constitution (V7) and new Constitution (V8)

(These are the only changes that will have a material effect on clubs, or operational effect on the Association)

- 1**
- V7. Executive of between 2-14 persons, including 6 Section Directors.
 - V8. Executive of 6 persons, excluding Section Directors.

- 2**
- V7. A delegate to a General Meeting can hold unlimited proxy votes.
 - V8. A delegate to a General Meeting can hold voting for no more than five (5) member clubs.

- 3**
- V7. Section Directors are elected annually at the AGM.
 - V8. Section Directors are appointed by Council for a 2 year term at the Council meeting after an AGM biennially.

- 4**
- V7. The Immediate Past President remains an ex-officio member of Council until they are no longer the IPP.
 - V8. The Immediate Past President is not a member of Council.

- 5**
- V7. It is difficult to admit any type of member except a Pistol Club.
 - V8. Council has the ability to admit Associate Members, whose terms of membership and any fees payable can be set on a case by case basis.

- 6**
- V7. Pistol NZ's policies (rules) are only held by members of Council in a "living" handbook, which are not always accurate and up to date.
 - V8. Pistol NZ's By-Laws will be kept in a single electronic document, which can be made available in a published format to clubs, and individuals.

- 7**
- V7. The Constitution can be amended by a simple majority of voting at a General Meeting.
 - V8. The Constitution can only be amended by at least 2/3 majority of voting at a General Meeting.
